What are Local Child Protection Groups?

Local child protection groups have existed across Fife since the 1990s. These are local forums of practitioners who:-

- meet regularly across Fife in their own areas
- discuss child care, protection and welfare issues.

Who are we?

Membership of the local child protection groups is voluntary and includes a wide range of practitioners from across the public, private and voluntary sectors who all have a shared interest in child protection.

For example our membership includes teachers, health visitors, nurses, social workers, police officers, foster carers and many other workers from a wide range of organisations. Everyone is welcome.

What do we do?

We meet on a regular basis to:-

- provide good local networking opportunities
- discuss local issues, trends and concerns
- promote good child protection practice
- support local child protection training and development
- share information with other Fife child protection networks
- support national and local child protection policy developments.



Why do we meet?

We meet because we believe that “**child protection is everyone’s job and everyone’s responsibility**”. We also believe that the welfare of our children is paramount.

We meet to:-

- actively support the work of Fife Child Protection Committee
- promote innovative and good child protection practice
- provide support to local practitioners in this very challenging area of work.
